## Accessibility Policy

At SRFC, we meet the information and communication needs of people with disabilities by providing, upon request, information and communications materials in accessible formats or with communication supports.

At SRFC, we “have regard” for people with disabilities when DESIGNING, PROCURING, OR ACQUIRING facility equipment/ furnishings. This means we consider what accessibility features we could build into facilities to best meet the needs of our customers and clients.

We provide emergency procedures, plans or public safety information to the public in an accessible format, on request. Real-time emergency information (such as announcements and alarms) is NOT INCLUDED.

## Emergency Procedures

### WORKPLACE EMERGENCY RESPONSE INFORMATION

We provide INDIVIDUALIZED workplace EMERGENCY RESPONSE INFORMATION TO EMPLOYEES WITH DISABILITIES if the disability makes it necessary, and the club is aware of the need. With the employee’s consent, we ensure the information is shared with anyone designated to assist them in an emergency. This information must be reviewed when:

- the employee moves to a different location in your club
- the employee’s overall accommodation needs are reviewed
- emergency response policies are reviewed

### PLAYER/VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

Each facility has their own unique protocols for that building/structure. We review these protocols with PLAYERS, PARENTS and VOLUNTEERS BEFORE they start with ANY PROGRAM/TEAM at SRFC.
